NOTES: The weather was cool for the first four days of the tour, particularly the first morning on Mt Wellington.

Highlights were a pair of **masked owls** in the Ouse area, about 20 **eastern quolls** on Bruny Island, five **ground parrots** at very close range, about 10 **orange-bellied parrots** at Melaleuca, a large male **platypus**, seen in a roadside dam near Buckland in the middle of the day and **mottled petrel** on the Eaglehawk Neck pelagic.

It was great to see the Tasmanian birds breeding so well after a wet summer; many birds had juveniles with them.
